All processes are reviewed at length, then compared with employee activities and operational documentation to validate compliance with the highest industry standards.

Also evaluated during this time is the adequacy of documentation, compliance to documented procedures, effectiveness of these procedures to control the food safety process within defined limits, and the ability to implement corrective and preventative action plans, including successfully execute a product recall if need be.
